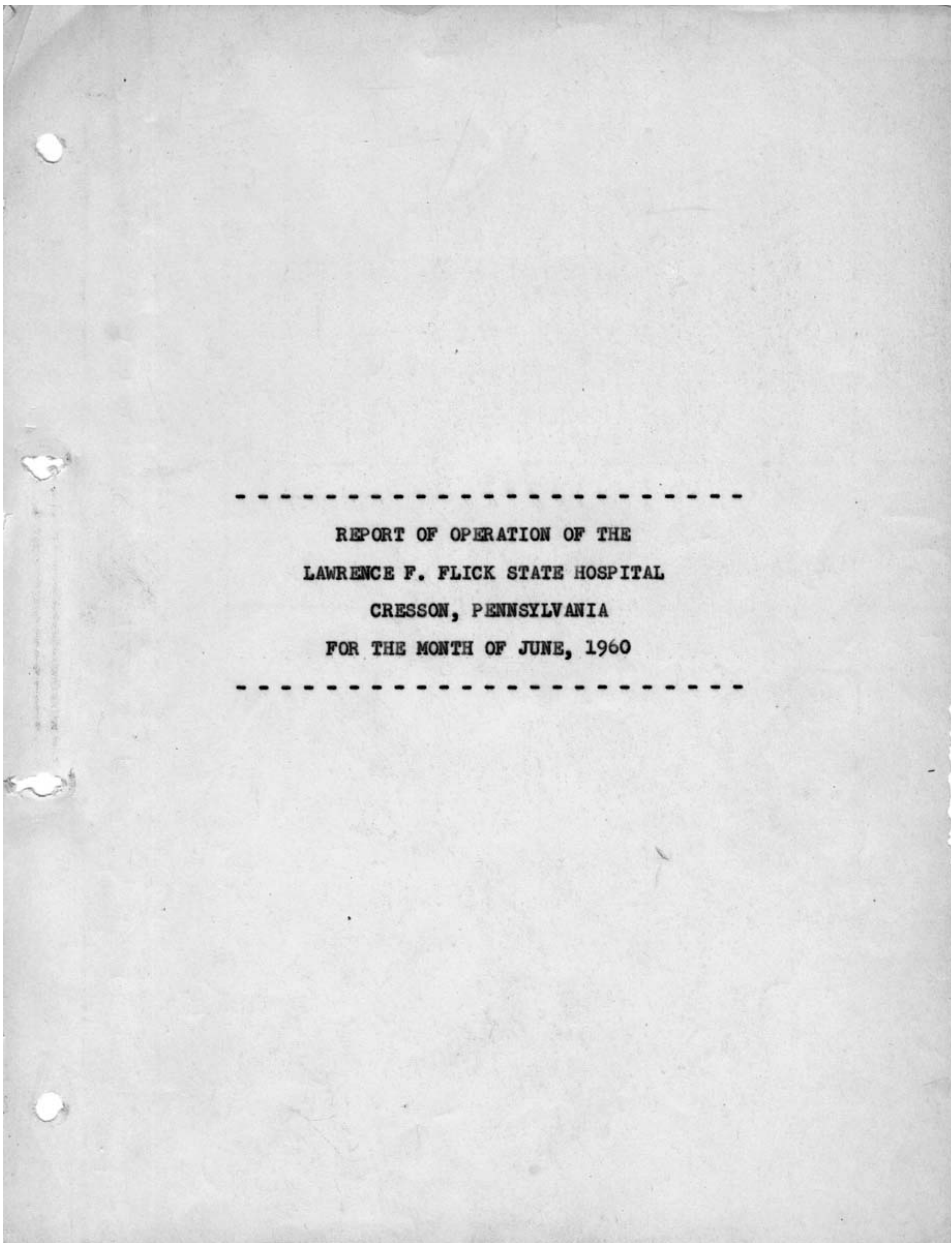

The reports have two basis sections: (1) a written section describing the activities of the staff and employees and (2) tables of statistical data concerning patient care and hospital operations. These reports are like time capsules giving us a glimpse into the people and activities at the sanatorium. As luck would have it, several of these reports were written in 1955 and 1956, the two years that I was a patient in the sanatorium and so I was there to witness some of these events .

##### Staff Education

Miss Bernice McGuire, R.N., Supervisor of the Medical Service Unit, received a scholarship to the 1960 Pennsylvania Community-School Health Education, held at the Pennsylvania State University, from June thirteenth to July first. Miss McGuire's application for the course was approved by Mr. Alvin Buck, Assistant County Superintendent of Schools, and by Mr. Joseph Oliverio, Executive Secretary of the Cambria County Tuberculosis and Health Society. Doctor Arthur L. Harnett, Professor of Physical Education, supervised the workshop program.

#### Miscellaneous Staff Education

Mr. Joseph Reed, Physiotherapist at the Veterans Administration Hospital, Altoona, lectured to all nursing personnel on the various "Physical Therapy Treatments and Corrective Exercises for the Strengthening of Arthritic Joints."
